## ENVIRONMENTAL and SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN (ESCP)

(Revised 6 May 2020)

## **ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN**

- The Lao People's Democratic Republic (Lao PDR) (hereinafter the Borrower) through the Ministry of Health (MOH) will implement the Laos COVID-19 Response Project (the Project), with the involvement of Provincial Health Offices, District Health Offices, and Health Centers. The International Development Association (hereinafter the Association) has agreed to provide financing for the Project.
- 2. The Borrower will implement material measures and actions so that the Project is implemented in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs). This Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP) sets out material measures and actions, any specific documents or plans, as well as the timing for each of these.
- 3. The Borrower is responsible for compliance with all requirements of the ESCP even when implementation of specific measures and actions is conducted by the Ministry, agency or unit referenced in 1. above.
- 4. Implementation of the material measures and actions set out in this ESCP will be monitored and reported to the Association by the Borrower as required by the ESCP and the conditions of the legal agreement, and the Association will monitor and assess progress and completion of the material measures and actions throughout implementation of the Project.
- 5. As agreed by the Association and the Borrower, this ESCP may be revised from time to time after each consultation with stakeholders during Project implementation, to reflect their feedback, adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to assessment of Project performance conducted under the ESCP itself. In such circumstances, the Borrower will agree to the changes with the Association and will update the ESCP to reflect such changes. Agreement on changes to the ESCP will be documented through the exchange of letters signed between the Association and the Borrower. The Borrower will promptly disclose the updated ESCP. Initial public consultations were conducted by MOH with stakeholders during April 13 to 20, 2020 to inform and sought their feedback and views regarding the project design, Environmental and Social risks and suggested mitigation measures. Given the ongoing restrictions due to COVID-19, consultations were conducted remotely by setting up a WhatsApp group in addition to the Ministry's website where project information was shared and discussed by stakeholders. Second consultation was conducted for ESMF during April 23 to May 4, 2020 using the same methodology that was conducted for ESCP and SEP, the outcomes of all consultations have been incorporated into the revised ESMF to be submitted for World Bank clearance and will be disclosed after along with an updated ESCP and SEP. The ESCP, SEP and ESMF could be further revised subject to the changes (if any) during the project implementation.
- 6. Where Project changes, unforeseen circumstances, or Project performance result in changes to the risks and impacts during Project implementation, the MOH shall provide additional funds, if needed, to implement actions and measures to address such risks and impacts.
